

# Using this checklist

This handy walk-through checklist covers all the main areas of most buildings. When you walk through your premises, consider either using a real wheelchair or making sure that adjust your height and think of things from a wheelchair users perspective. Similarly, consider various situations throughout from the perspective of someone with visual or hearing disabilities to make sure you don't miss anything. Here's what to make a note of in this checklist.



#### **FEATURE**

We've listed all the main features that you might need to check are accessible. Some of these have been broken down into easy categories and we have tried to separate key categories on different pages so you can break your audit down however you like. If you haven't got a feature, just skip it!



### **ACCESSIBILITY**

If the feature we've listed is accessible as described then you can tick Y for yes and move on! Otherwise circle no and address the accessibility.



#### **NOTES**

If the feature isn't accessible, make some more notes on why it's isn't and any other relevant information to help find a solution.



### **SOLUTION**

If the solution isn't obvious then you might to do a bit of research, but once you've found one, not it down and use the solutions list a running to-do list to implement accessibility changes.



#### SOLUTION ACTIONED

This is so you can check off once you have a solution implemented and can even make a note of the date for future reference and audits.

# Common obstacles and solutions

Today there are plenty of accessibility solutions available and many are relatively inexpensive. While the width of doorways and corridors may need to be overcome by reorganising your business or carrying out some construction, we've done some of the hard work for you by listing some of the more common and easily overcome obstacles along with some suggested solutions.

OBSTACLE	SOLUTION
Thresholds and steps	Temporary and portable wheelchair ramps
Stair cases and long steps	Temporary or semi-permanent wheelchair ramps
Heavy doors	Automatic doors or bells for assitance
Long corridors and walkways	Handrails along walls and at critical points for support
Tall counters and table	Install a lower counter or a low table area
Wires, cable and floor obstructions	Cable protector ramps and bridging ramps

Hearing disabilities	Audio loops, written information, clear sings
Visual disabilities	Braille information and signs, audio assitance and support

### MAKE YOUR BUSINESS ACCESSIBLE

Buy affordable wheelchair ramps including threshold ramps, bridging ramps and even semi-permanent ramps plus cable ramps and protectors for obstructions.
